This policy has been drafted in accordance with Regulation (EU) 2016/679 (“GDPR”), the UK GDPR and the UK Data Protection Act 2018, as well as applicable United States privacy laws, including the California Consumer Privacy Act as amended by the California Privacy Rights Act (“CCPA/CPRA”), where applicable.
